Prof. Anuradha Sharma welcomed all the members of the committee. Following issues were discussed:

1. Percentage of power requirements met by renewable energy sources should be sought from XEN office.
2. For differently abled student's facilities, data provided from departments should be submitted in AQARs. However, for students availing scribes for their examination, data should be sought from controller examination / special opportunity cell.
3. The committee selected eco-friendly initiatives for each academic year as per Annexure-I.
4. The committee selected promising best practices of the departments (Annexure-II) for inclusion as University's best practices on condition that departments should provide information of their best practice as per NAAC format. Moreover, committee suggested some other innovative activities conducted by departments which can be considered for inclusion in university's best practices.
