Report/Analysis of the Feedback Collected (2019-2020)

Student Feedback

In the pursuit of providing the best education to the students and to understand their concerns, students were asked for feedbacks. Students brought forth some issues regarding time table, the fact that back to back classes become hectic and tiring for them. Keeping in view this issue, department started exclusive meetings to set up the time tables with special lectures/presentations in between classes to make their learning and classes more interesting.

Faculty feedback

The faculty feedback summarises the collective effort of students scholars and the faculty itself to cultivate academic excellence, and new ideas to ground philosophical education. Understanding contemporary trends can provide important insights to help retain interest and shed light on how the department of philosophy is fulfilling its mission to educate and innovate.

Alumni feedback

The alumni of the department intermittently visited the department and showed their interest in the development of future practices and initiatives aimed to advance scholastic activities.

Parents' Feedback

The Department Conducted a feedback collection activity whereby the feedback of the parents of students, Selected Randomly, through online mode and as per the guidelines provided thereof. On analysing the results of the said feedback collection it was interesting to note that: Most of the parents are satisfied by the decision of their ward to adopt the current course of study. 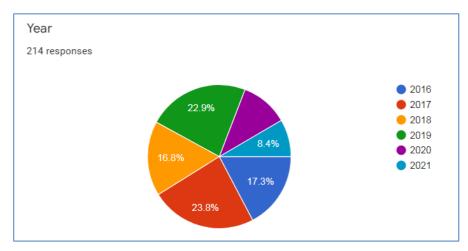


Figure 1: Responses received from year 2016 to 2021

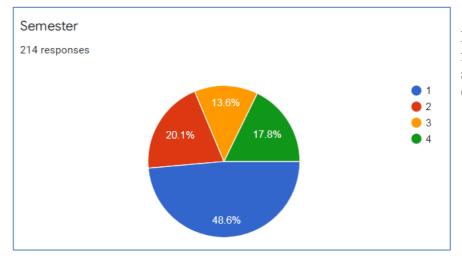


Figure 2: Responses from even and odd sem. Students (distribution)

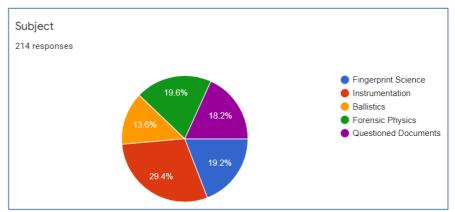
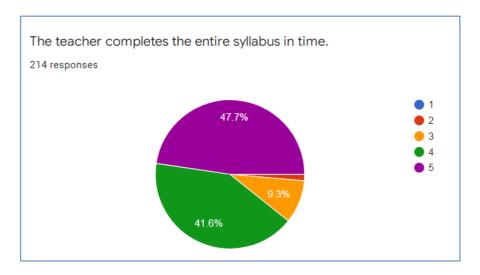
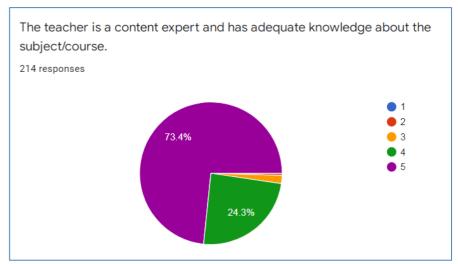
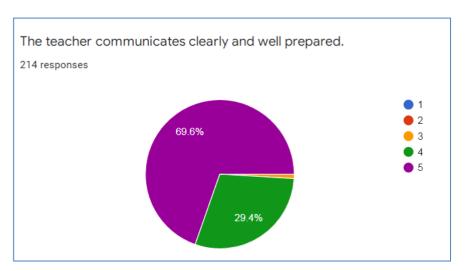
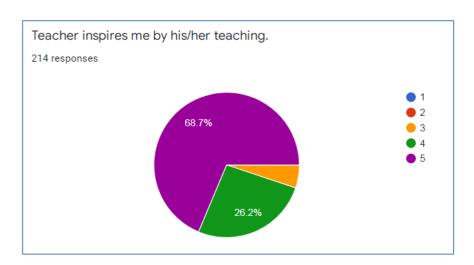


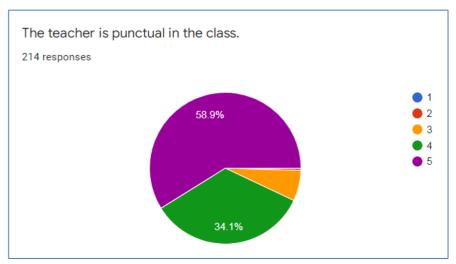
Figure 3: Course wise distribution of responses collected.

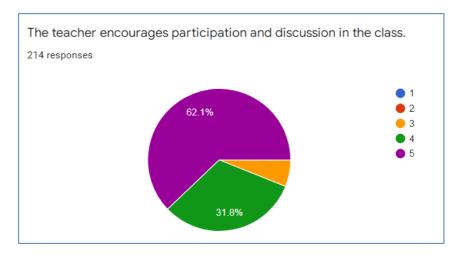


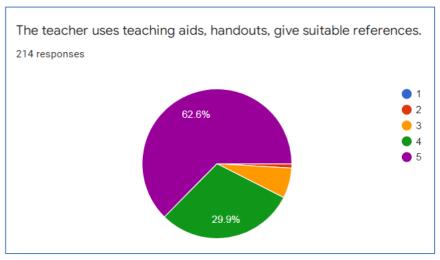


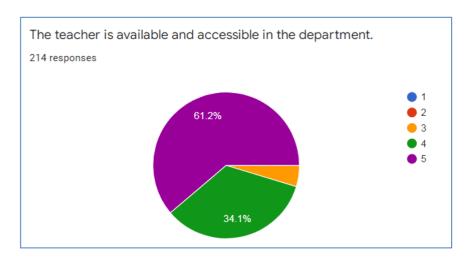


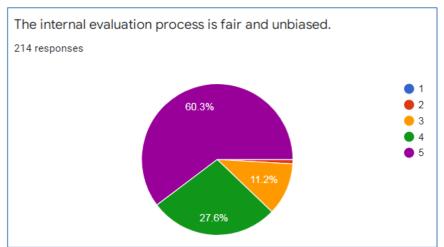


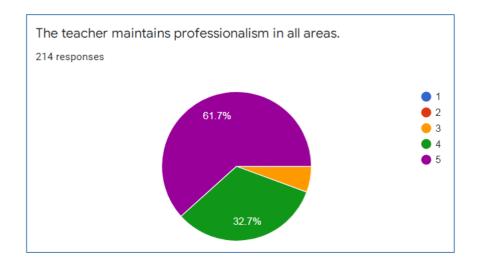












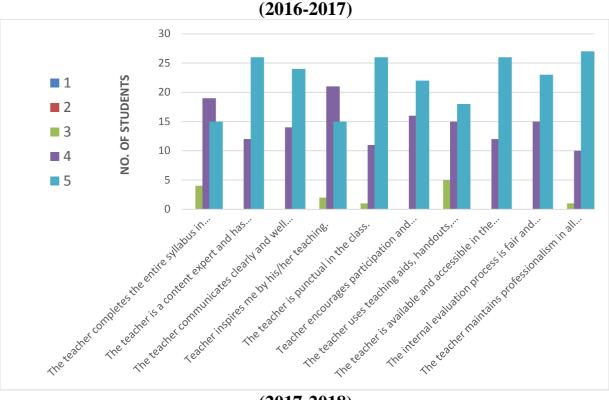

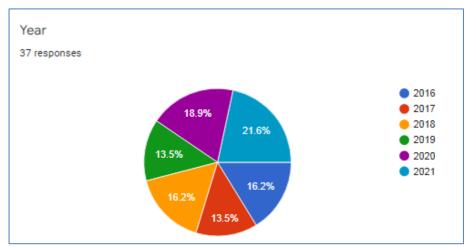
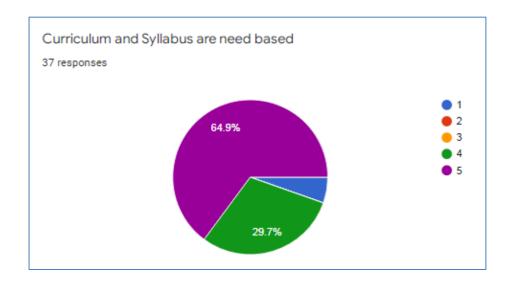
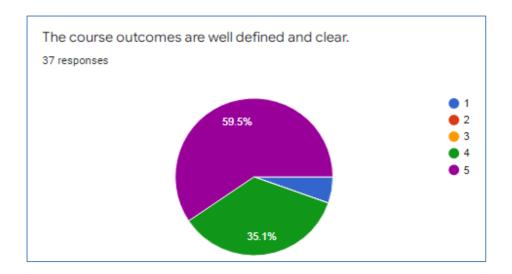
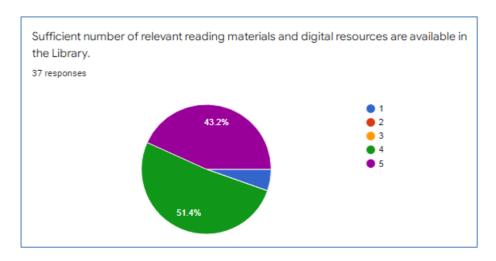
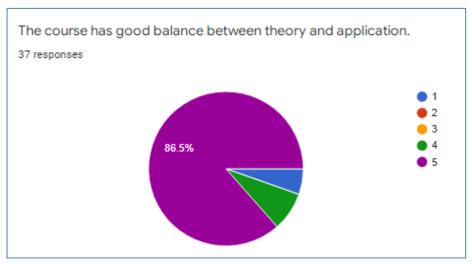


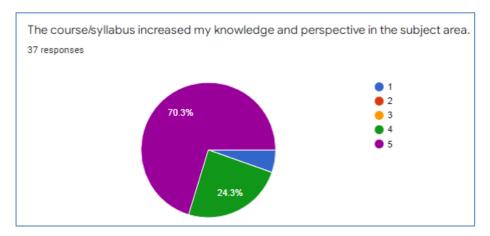
Figure: Batch wise (Year) distribution of responses received.

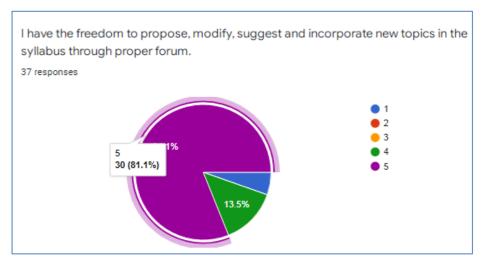


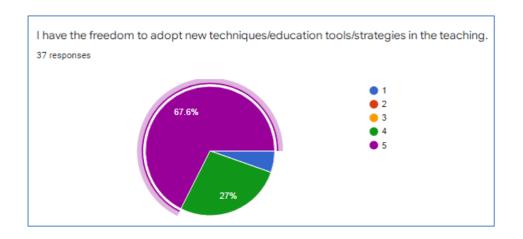


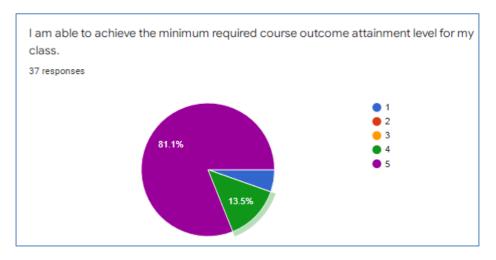


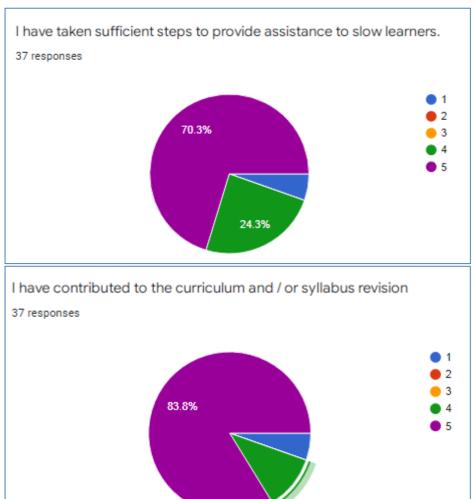






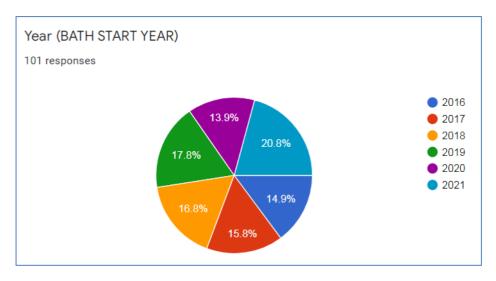


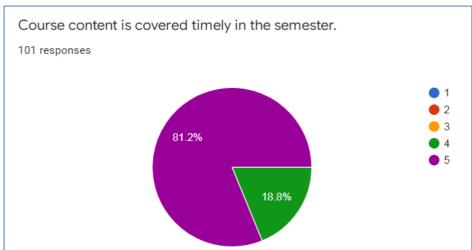


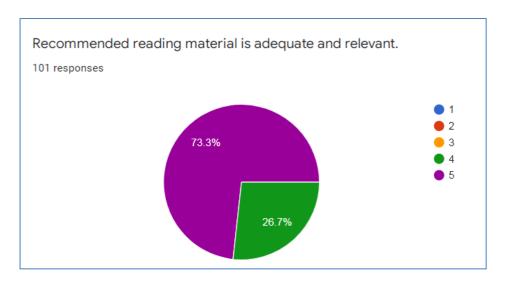


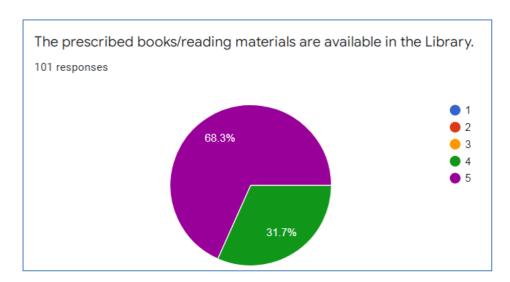

Suggestions (Feedback given by the students) was discussed in Joint Academic & Administrative Committee (JAAC) of UCIM /CIL/SAIF and appropriate steps were taken unanimously to:

- a) Syllabus of M.Sc. (Instrumentation), subject -Advanced Fabrication Techniques was modified and Practical element was introduced.
- b) Books for MSc. (Instrumentation) and M.Tech (Instrumentation) were segregated in essential and reference books.
- c) Scheme of Examination for MSc. (Instrumentation) and M.Tech (Instrumentation) was modified and examiners are to set 7 questions with sections A & B of the syllabus.

Modifications done in the syllabus were got approved by the Board of Studies (BoS) of UCIM /CIL/SAIF in 2019.

Feedback of Students

The students suggestions regarding the choice of research topics were included in the list, which also catered to their interest areas. The pattern of undertaking a research topic was also remodelled to match the inter-department competitive atmosphere. Given the chnaging methods of teaching, various visual aids were made a part of the classroom teaching. The frameworks of the assignments were edited and modified according to the need of the course and the time of each semester. The students were introduced to presentation skills and soft skills, to help them boost their skills.

Feedback of Teachers

The challenges faced in mentoring various issues were discussed to chalk out a common approach. The suggestions given by the faculty regarding the mentorship were incorporated. The steps to be taken to tackle the students' indiscipline were drafted, in which the students were to be assigned responsibilty roles.

Feedback of Employers

Feedback from employers stressed the need to encourage inter-department activities and competitions. The inputs regarding the implementation of the discipline of classrooms and labs were taken into consideration.

Feedback of Alumni

The members of the alumni suggested about interactive sessions with students, so that they have the opportunity of knowing about the experiences of the designers and entrepreneurs. The students gained knowledge about the mistakes that can be avoided and learned from before entering their professional domains. Some suggestions regarding the changes required in the pattern of teaching were adopted. The theoretical learning was matched with practical learning of all subjects to make the students more confident.

Feedback of Parents

Parents welcomed the idea of new teaching methods being adopted in classroom teaching. A regular update to the parents was made about their ward's attendance, performance and behaviour, who demanded that they should be informed about the above. The course objectives were shared with the parents to help them understand the credibility of the course.

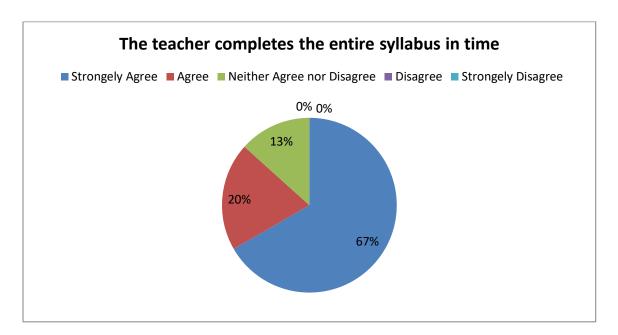
